Visits are generally carried out between Monday and Thursday at 10am on a pre-booked basis and last between 60 and 90 minutes. We have a small number of evening visits and some at the weekend due to extenuating circumstances e.g. scout groups who only meet at these times. We do not hold afternoon visits as a funeral may be required at short notice and logistically we cannot host the visit with such large groups of people in the mosque.

Visits are hosted by a group of volunteer tour guides who are highly committed and experienced in the role. We are now in the process of expanding our bank of volunteer guides for the purposes of continuity and sustainability.
